Clean Up Your Social Media While Job Searching

Social media allows us to be more connected than ever before. Unfortunately this means that potential employers are able to learn more about us than we would like. It's more common than you may think for these discoveries to prevent employers from even considering an application. Roughly one in three employers have rejected candidates based on something they found out about them online.

- Google yourself to find out what others can learn about you.
- Change your settings where necessary, so your private life stays private.
- A picture is worth a thousand words, so make sure all of yours say something positive about you. If publicly viewable images are unprofessional, remove them or set them to private.
- Why do employers research candidates online?
 - 1. To gauge a candidate's professionalism in terms of social conduct.
 - 2. To evaluate a candidate's fit into the company culture.
 - 3. To learn more about the candidate's qualifications.

Try this: Start Tweeting information that is both interesting & relevant to your industry. Keep up to date with industry news by following individuals & companies related to your preferred job. This also demonstrates a genuine interest in your field, which potential employers will appreciate.
