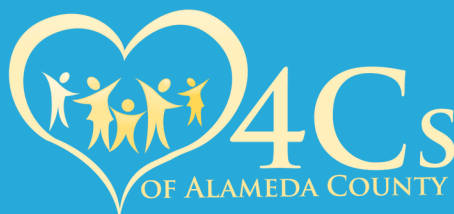




4Cs of Alameda County

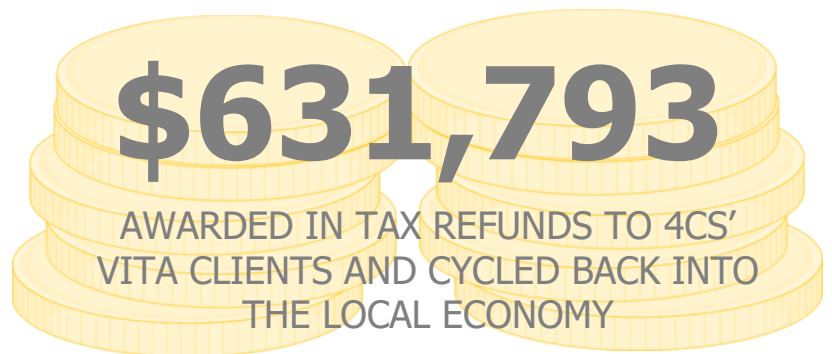

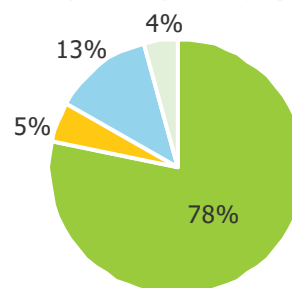
