

# **Letter from 4Cs Leadership**

Dear friend of 4Cs,

Fifty years ago a group of community members gathered together to try to figure out a solution to help families better access high quality child care in Alameda County. As the number of women in the workforce passed the 50% mark in the early 1970s, two parents working outside the home was more common than not and child care for little ones was becoming critical to the success of thriving families. In December 1972, this group of determined folks in Southern Alameda County founded Community Childcare Coordinating Council of Alameda County. Fast forward five decades - and a few name adjustments - later and 4Cs of Alameda County has become an essential family resource agency serving parents, children, child care providers, and community members across the county. Over the past 50 years 4Cs has seen the ebb and flow of supports and resources for our programs from federal, state, and local governments come and go, we've remained a beacon of hope and strength in the midst of a global pandemic, and we have always risen to meet the needs of our neighbors thanks to our leadership, staff, community of supporters, and donors like you.

As you can see in this report, the timeline and breadth of services provided by 4Cs of Alameda County is incredible and impactful. Hundreds of thousands of families and child care providers have been served by 4Cs with millions positively impacted by our work since 1972. 4Cs has provided families with access and referrals to child care, diapers, navigation, clothing, backpacks, toys, books, classes, free tax preparation and filing, car seat installation checks, and more. 

Community members have access to parenting classes, family navigation, diapers, wipes, clothing, food, backpacks and school supplies, books, toys, free tax preparation and filing, and car seat installation checks.




